## OFF LICENCE

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), JKTO HOLDING LIMITED (the licensee) is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at 141B COMMERCE STREET, WHAKATANE and known as WHAKATANE SUPER LIQUOR, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

### CONDITIONS

(a) Alcohol may be sold on, and delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:

Sunday to Wednesday, 0700 to 2200hrs  
Thursday to Saturday, 0700 to 2300hrs

- (b) no alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1:00pm on Anzac Day;
- (c) A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in premises.
- (d) While alcohol is being supplied as a free sample, water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at the place where the samples are being supplied.
- (e) The Licensee must have available for consumption off the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
- (f) The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.
- (g) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - Staff must be trained in their responsibility to prevent sale of alcohol to minors or intoxicated people.
  - Signage displayed at every point of sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
  - At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
